- Consult and collaborate with our employees (full and part time), their representatives and relevant stakeholders in matters affecting their health and safety.
- Provide a positive safety culture in which every employee, contractor and visitor feels free to speak up about non-conformances, undesirable or unsafe situations or any other H&S related issue.

We will seek to improve our EHS performance through the setting of our targets and objectives and through the implementation of our Zero Harm program. Ultimate responsibility for health and safety rests with the Chief Executive Officer. However, safety is the responsibility of everyone at work, and all employees including managers and supervisors, must accept responsibility for EHS issues within their own control, as set out in the statement.

The organisation and responsibilities for carrying out this Safety Policy are set out in the Company Safety Statement and our EHS Team will provide advice and assistance in complying with this statement. This will be made available at all locations where we carry out our operations and to any interested parties.
